Hurricane lan



- lan has strengthened to a Major Hurricane this morning, and is currently over western Cuba. Ian will continue northward as a Major Hurricane and make landfall on the Florida peninsula early Thursday morning.
- Though lan will weaken after landfall and track to our west, impacts to eastern NC are expected beginning Friday and lasting through much of this weekend.

The extent of these impacts will continue to be <u>highly dependent</u> on the eventual track and speed of lan.

- The most probable local threats will be widespread heavy rain with the potential for flash flooding & coastal flooding.

Potential For Flash Flooding



- A combination of an offshore front and tropical moisture associated with lan will lead to an **extended period of heavy rain** across Eastern NC late this week.
- As a result there will be the potential for flash flooding.
- Right now the heaviest amounts are expected along the coast, but that could shift as it is highly dependent on the eventual track and speed of lan as it tracks over the Southeast US.
- There is also the potential for at least minor flooding of local main stem rivers, as well as smaller tributaries and creeks.
