


Hurricane Helene

- Be sure your phone is charged and not turned off.
- Have multiple ways to receive warnings.
- Know where your safe place is, if a


WARNING is issued.



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Dangerous Rip Currents Through Friday



Rip currents are powerful currents of water moving away from shore. They can sweep even the strongest swimmer away from shore. If at all possible, swim near a lifeguard.

- **Dangerous rip currents and high surf** expected.
- Do not enter the surf under RED FLAG conditions. Visit lifeguarded beaches.
- Know how to get out of a rip current by swimming left or right (parallel to coast).




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Total Rainfall

Hurricane Helene



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Based on the current track, the most significant rainfall would remain WEST of our area.

Rain may be briefly heavy at times before ending rapidly by Friday evening.


Low risk for flooding given our predicted rainfall amounts but monitoring closely given our

saturated soil.



Maximum Wind Gusts

- Little to no impact due to overall low wind speeds.
- the coastal waters, especially south of Cape
 - Hatteras.
