



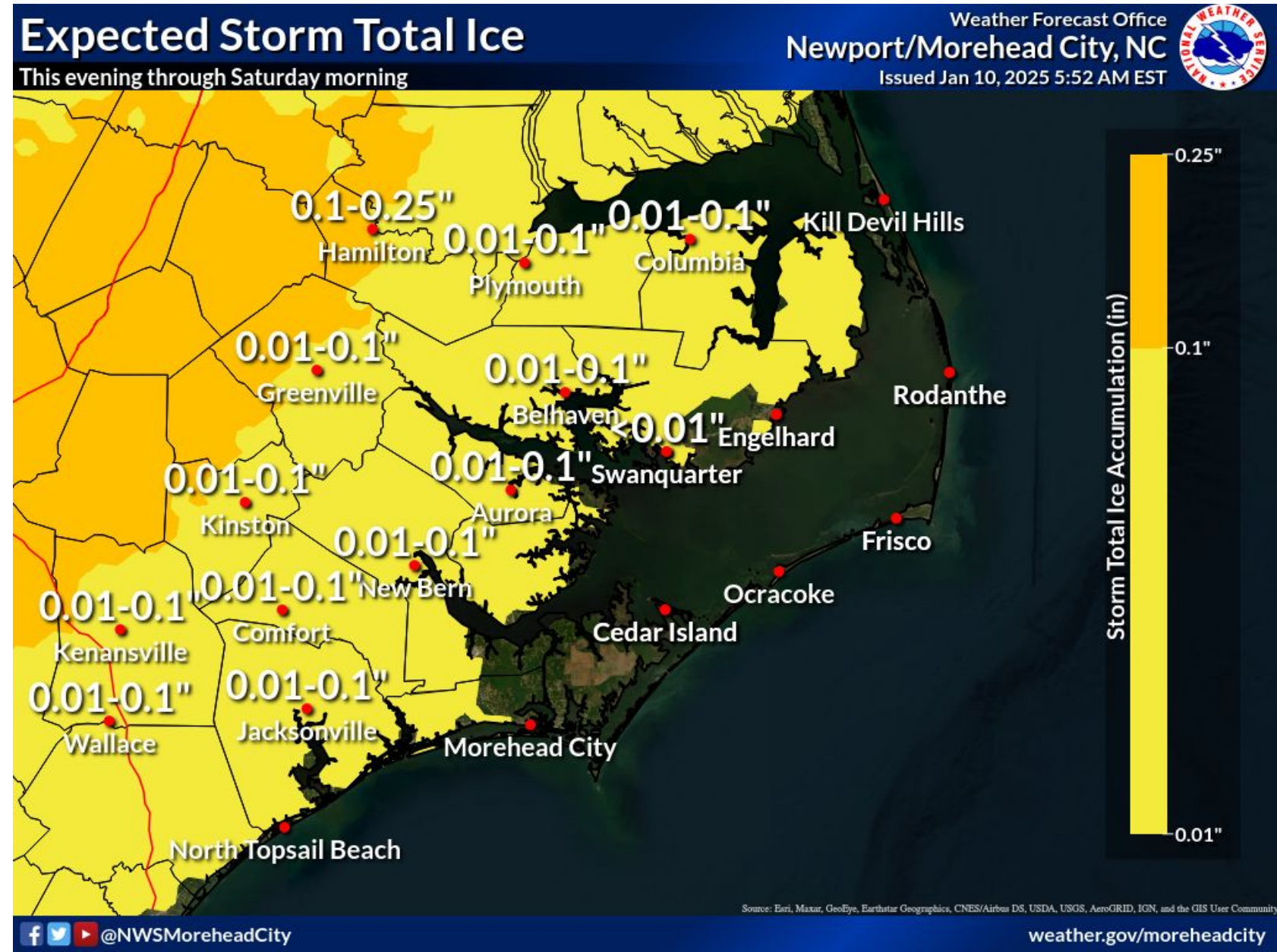

- Highest impact will be this evening through early Saturday morning

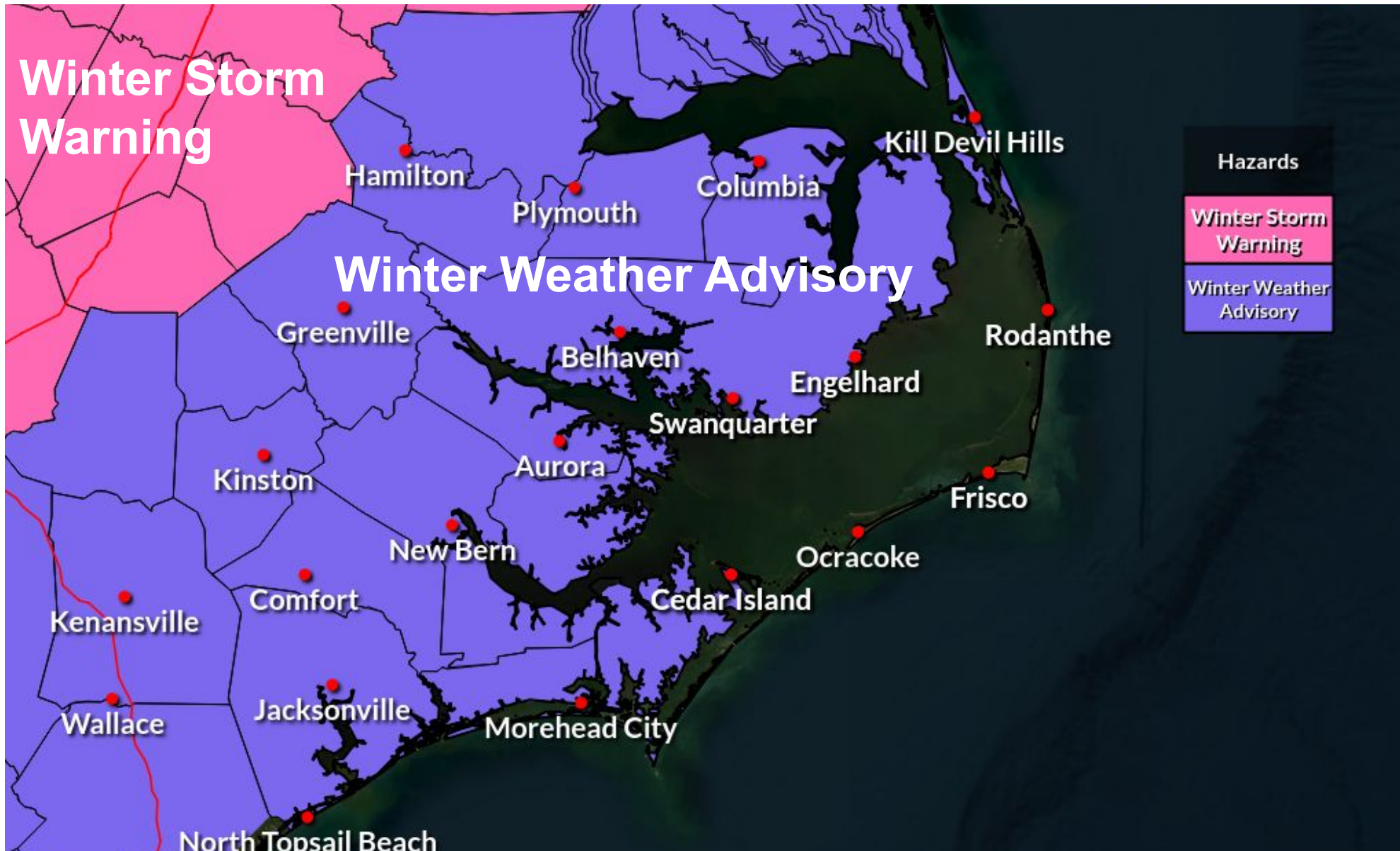




# Winter Storm Headlines

- An advisory is for a nuisance snow or ice event.
- A warning is for a more impactful snow or ice event.

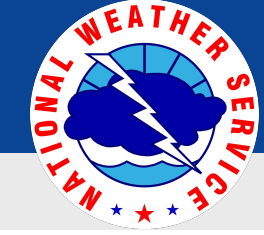
### Effects and Impacts Legend

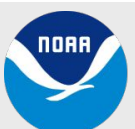
## What We Know

- Highest threat for snow and ice will be inland from the coast
- The majority of the event will occur tonight through early Saturday morning

## Uncertainties

- Amounts are dependent on the storm track and **MAY CHANGE** dramatically from town to town, especially as you go inland.

<b>Precipitation Type</b>	<b>Snow</b>	<b>Snow/Ice/Sleet</b>	<b>Rain</b>	<b>None</b>
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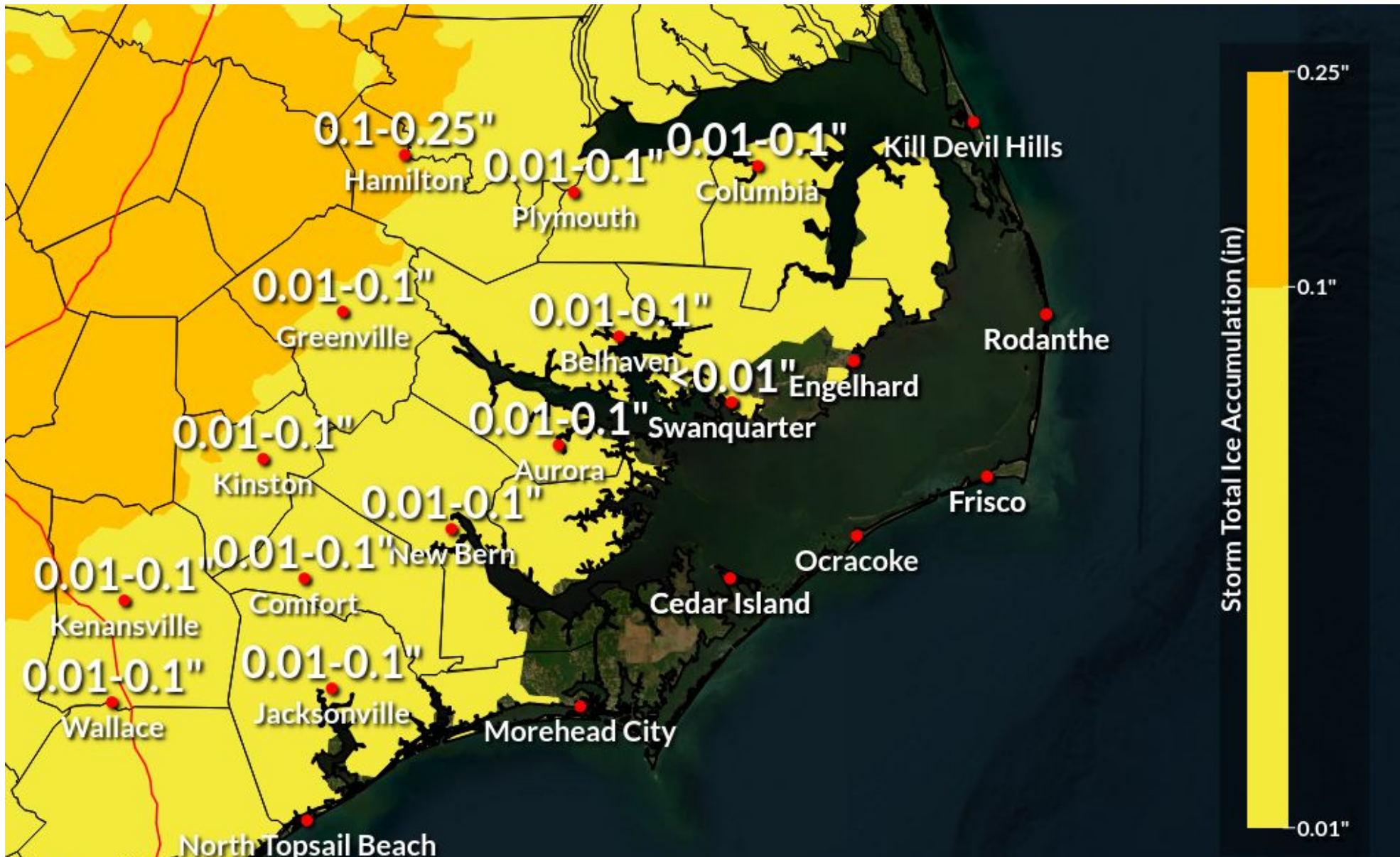


# Expected Storm Total Ice

January 10, 2025  
6:15 AM

Tonight through Saturday morning

- Biggest impact overnight tonight.
- Heavier icing is MOST LIKELY the farther NORTH and WEST you live.
- A small amount of ice can have a big impact, especially on bridges and overpasses.





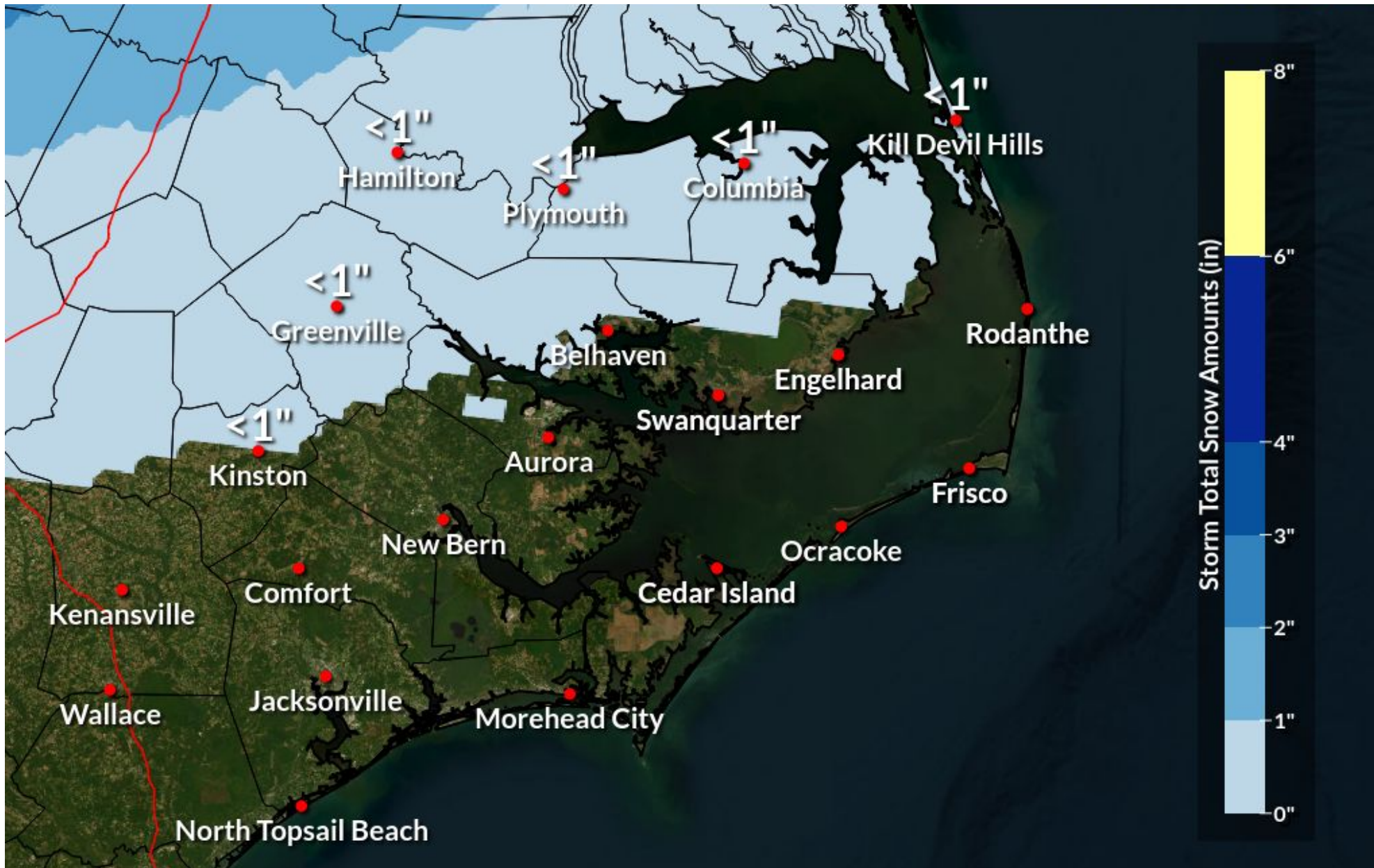


# Expected Storm Total Snowfall

January 10, 2025  
6:15 AM

This includes both snow and sleet

- Biggest impact overnight tonight.
- Heavier snow is MOST LIKELY the farther NORTH and WEST you live.
- Accumulating snow and ice possible on roads due to our continued stretch of very cold air.





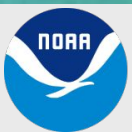
# Ice and Snow, Take it Slow

Leave extra space between you and the vehicle in front of you



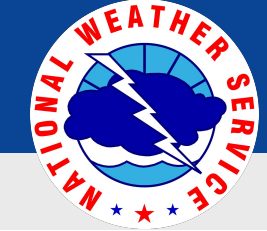
